

Why Urban Gardens?

- Cost-efficient way to address many of the city's strategic goals
- Small-scale projects that can be then up-scaled to a city-wide level
- Alignment with UN Sustainable Development Goals, EU Urban agenda, Spanish Urban Agenda









Benefits: multifunctional approach

Increase biodiversity and boost ecology

Improve resilience against climate change challenges

Provide a sustainable public space offering healthy recreational opportunities

Protect and reinforce ethnographic and cultural values of environment

Increase social cohesion and community engagement

Provide a space for **environmental education**

Promote new sustainable economic activities / entrepreneurship opportunities

Eirís, Novo Mesoiro, Agra














First steps of the network

ecoHORTAS Project

- 218 new individual plots avaliable for citizens in three locations
- UG as a social tool: Priority for vulnerable collectives
- Workshops:

 Group facilitation
 Organic agriculture











First steps of the network

Other Urban Gardens:

- School Urban Gardens: five primary schools so far have installed an urban garden with support from the municipality
- Community Gardens: two municipal community gardens and a third being developed in urban parks, working with NGOs

Private Urban Gardens: private initiatives, some nonprofit (Hortas Val de Feáns), some commercial (Portiño)













Ru:rban project (URBACT)

Transfer the good practices of Rome on urban agriculture







Three elements:

- Capacity building
- Regulation
- Gardeniser program








Breaking the silos
